Parole Determination Anthony Jones

Parole Granted

The NSW State Parole Authority today made a parole order for Anthony Jones.

The offender was convicted of the murder of a man at a party in Dee Why in May 2010.

He was sentenced to 18 years and 8 months expiring 14 February 2029, with a non-parole period of 14 years expiring, 14 June 2024.

A public parole review hearing was told reports submitted by the Serious Offenders Review Council and Community Corrections supported his conditional release to supervised parole.

Both reports noted the offender had completed numerous programs to address his offending; had participated in external leave in preparation for his transition into the community and was pursuing a degree in tertiary education.

Further, with the benefit of stable accommodation and a comprehensive plan to support his reintegration and monitor his risk of re-offending, the Authority was advised there appeared to be no significant benefit in keeping Jones in custody beyond his eligible parole date.

The State advised it did not oppose his release to supervised parole.

On the material before it, the Authority determined parole should be granted, ordering Jones be released with supervision and conditions on 14 June 2024.

On parole he must comply with:

- Standard Conditions of parole 1-11
- Additional Conditions that he must:
 - Abstain from alcohol.
 - Not use a prohibited drug or substance, except those prescribed to him.
 - Not contact, communicate with, watch, stalk, harass or intimidate the victim's family.
 - Not frequent or visit the Northern Beaches Local Government Area

His parole order expires 14 December 2027, unless revoked.
