

Parole Determination

Eddy Sjahadi

Parole Granted

The NSW State Parole Authority has made a parole order for Eddy Sjahadi determining his release to supervised parole as appropriate and in the interests of community safety.

On parole he is banned from entering the following Local Government Areas: Bayside, Canterbury- Bankstown, City of Sydney, Inner West, North Sydney, Randwick, Waverley and Woollahra.

Mr Sjahadi was sentenced to 19 years for the 2010 murder of his sister-in-law, with a non-parole period of 14 years which expired 10 December 2024. A fixed 9-month sentence for breach of apprehended domestic violence order expired 10 September 2025.

The Serious Offenders Review Council and Community Corrections advised the Authority Sjahadi has completed therapeutic programs to address his offending while in custody and will undertake further interventions while continuing to serve his remaining sentence in the community.

He also successfully participated in pre-release leave, including in the Reintegration and Intensive Support Team (RIST) as part of a pilot program preparing offenders for reintegration.

The Authority was advised on his release from custody, Sjahadi will be housed at supported CSNSW accommodation.

Following a review hearing in August, the Authority reserved its decision which was handed down last month.

The offender was conditionally released 26 September 2025 and on parole must comply with the 11 Standard Conditions and Additional Conditions imposed by the Authority that he must:

- Refrain entirely from gambling and must, if directed by his officer, seek assistance/counselling in controlling his gambling.
- not contact or communicate with the victim's family without the express prior approval of his officer.
- Not frequent or visit the Local Government Areas of Bayside, Canterbury-Bankstown, City of Sydney, Inner West, North Sydney, Randwick, Waverley and Woollahra.

This parole order expires 10 December 2029, unless revoked.
