Parole Determination Luis Leslie Falk-Meyn

Parole Granted

The NSW State Parole Authority has made a parole order for inmate Luis Leslie Falk-Meyn.

He is serving a 15-year sentence for shoot with intent to murder and possess unauthorised prohibited firearm.

His sentence expires 23 November 2026 and his NPP of 12 years expired in November 2023, when he was refused parole on the advice of the Serious Offenders Review Council (SORC).

A parole hearing today confirmed Community Corrections and the SORC now support his release to supervised parole, subject to a robust risk management plan which includes strict conditions.

The SORC advised parole is appropriate noting "...we see a lengthy period of supervision on parole, together with his strong pro-social family support as much more likely to foster his reintegration and the protection of the community, as there is no further custodial program that will assist."

The State did not oppose parole.

Having considered all the material before it, the Authority was satisfied releasing the inmate on supervised parole is in the interests of the safety of the community and directed he be released not earlier than 19 November 2024 and not later than 26 November 2024.

Falk-Meyn must comply with Standard Conditions 1-11 and additional conditions that he must:

- not use a prohibited drug or substance, except those prescribed to him
- participate in the following intervention, VOTP Maintenance
- not possess or use a firearm or any prohibited weapon. not contact, communicate with, watch, stalk, harass or intimidate the victim's family.

His parole order expires 23 November 2026, unless the order is revoked.
