

Parole Determination Paul Offer

13 March 2025

Parole Granted

The NSW State Parole Authority has made a parole order for Paul Offer who will continue serving his sentence in the community while being supervised by authorities and monitored for compliance with parole conditions.

Offer was convicted of murder and sentenced to 34 years, expiring 16 October 2031.

Released on parole 16 October 2022, the order was revoked 7 January 2023 after he was charged with possession of a taser.

For that offence, he was sentenced to 3 years with a non-parole period of 2 years, making him eligible for conditional release 4 January 2025.

The Serious Offenders Review Council advised the Parole Authority it was “satisfied that his release to parole is sufficient for his re-integration and the protection of the public.”

Community Corrections also recommended parole, confirming Offer has full time employment on release and a comprehensive plan has been formulated to manage his reintegration into the community.

The State made a submission opposing parole, arguing Offer would benefit from a further period of external leave.

Considering all the available material and evidence, the Authority determined it is satisfied release on parole is in the interests of the safety of the community.

Offer will be released not earlier than 27 March 2025 and not later than 3 April 2025.

On parole, he must comply with:

- Standard Conditions of parole 1-11 and
- Additional Conditions he:
 - Participate in the following intervention, CSNSW Psychology
 - Not possess or use a firearm or any prohibited weapon
 - Not contact, communicate with, watch, stalk, harass or intimidate the victim or victim's family
 - Not visit or frequent the LGS of Canterbury Bankstown

His parole order expires 16 October 2031 unless revoked.
