

Parole Determination Richard Relator

Parole Granted

The NSW State Parole Authority has made a parole order for serious sex offender Richard Relator who will be subject to Mandatory 24/7 Electronic Monitoring and exclusion zones while in the community.

On parole he will reside at a CSNSW-run facility, where he will be monitored and supervised in a highly structured regime to support his reintegration.

Relator was resentenced on appeal to 13 years and 6 months for the persistent sexual abuse of a child between 2011 and 2014.

The imposed non-parole period of 10 years makes him eligible for release on supervised parole from 3 December 2024.

A public review hearing today confirmed a Community Corrections pre-release report recommended parole as the offender has completed his program pathway in custody and is assessed as having a below average risk of sexual re-offending.

The Serious Offender Review Council, which manages all serious offenders in custody, also supported his release on parole advising it was appropriate and sufficient for the safety of the community.

There were no State Submissions opposing parole.

As a serious sex offender, Relator is subject to Mandatory Electronic Monitoring.

Having considered all the material before it, the Authority was satisfied releasing Relator on parole with a robust post-release plan, electronic monitoring and while living in a supported facility, is in the interests of protecting the safety of the community.

His release is not earlier than 3 December 2024 and not later than 10 December 2024.

He must comply with Standard Conditions 1-11 and Additional Conditions that he must:

- participate in CSNSW Psychology services.
- not contact, communicate with, watch, stalk, harass or intimidate the victim's family.
- not be in the company of a person under the age of 16 years unless accompanied by a responsible adult, as determined by his Officer. He must not engage in written or electronic communication (including through social media) with any person under

the age of 16, other than with those approved by his Officer.

- comply with all conditions and requirements of the Child Protection Register
- not frequent or visit the LGAs of Blacktown, Cumberland, Hornsby, Parramatta, and City of Sydney

His parole order expires 3 June 2028, unless the order is revoked.
