Parole Determination Todd Andrew Pearce

Parole Granted

The NSW State Parole Authority has made a parole order for Todd Andrew Pearce.

He is serving a 20-year sentence for the murder of a man in Hamilton in 2007, and another sentence of 3 years, with a non-parole period of 2 years and 3 months, for reckless wounding in company, while in custody.

He became eligible for parole on 17 November 2024.

In September, the Authority formed an intention to refuse parole stating the need for the offender to complete a program addressing his offending behaviour of violence.

A public review hearing today heard Pearce completed the Violent Offenders Treatment Program last month with positive reports. and that the Serious Offenders Review Council and Community Corrections now supported his release to parole.

Community Corrections advised a robust supervision plan had been developed to manage his reintegration into the community, including ongoing mental health treatment.

The State did not oppose his release to parole, subject to additional conditions.

Having considered all the material before it, the Authority was satisfied releasing Pearce with a comprehensive post-release plan to monitor and manage his reintegration is in the interests of protecting the safety of the community.

His release is not earlier than 24 December 2024 and not later than 30 December 2024.

He must comply with Standard Conditions 1-11 and Additional Conditions that he must:

- Not use a prohibited drug or substance unless prescribed to him.
- Participate in the VOTP Maintenance program.
- Comply with all directions of the mental health team, including treatment and medication.
- Not contact, communicate with, watch, stalk, harass or intimidate the victim's family.
- Not contact, communicate, or associate with co-offenders without express prior approval for his officer.

His parole order expires 18 August 2027, unless the order is revoked.
