Parole Determination Clayton John Wilson

Parole Granted

The NSW State Parole Authority has made a parole order for Clayton John Wilson determining his release on parole appropriate and in the interests of community safety.

Wilson was convicted of the murder of his housemate at a home in Forster on 19 December 2006 and sentenced to 25 years with a non-parole period of 18 years.

At a review hearing today, the Authority said the Serious Offender's Review Council (SORC) and Community Corrections recommended his release to parole.

It was noted he has completed programs to address his offending; has successfully participated in external leave and has suitable employment and accommodation on his release into the community.

The State did not oppose parole.

Having considered all the material before it, the Authority panel determined parole to be in the interests of the safety of the community and directed Wilson be released 10 May 2025.

Wilson must comply with Standard Conditions 1-11 and additional conditions that he MUST:

- Abstain from alcohol.
- Not contact, communicate with, watch, stalk, harass or intimidate the victim's family.
- Not frequent or visit the Local Government Areas of Mid Coast, Port Macquarie-Hastings and Greater Taree.

Wilson's parole order expires 10 May 2032, unless the order is revoked.
